

Fort Campbell Land Use Compatibility Study

Planning Together for Growth and Readiness

The Greater Nashville Regional Council, along with Fort Campbell and communities in Montgomery and Stewart counties in Tennessee and Christian and Trigg counties in Kentucky, is leading the Fort Campbell Land Use Compatibility Study to help shape recommendations to protect base facilities and training areas while supporting community growth and development outside the base.

The study is a collaborative planning effort to help Fort Campbell and surrounding communities prepare for future growth. Fort Campbell is a power projection platform and a major maneuver installation for the U.S. Army, training and deploying forces to support operations around the world. It is home to the Army's most deployed contingency forces. The goal of this study is to support Fort Campbell's mission while guiding safe, economically competitive growth that benefits both the military and surrounding communities.

What is a Land Use Compatibility Study?

A Land Use Compatibility Study is a planning process that identifies ways for a military installation and surrounding communities to grow and operate successfully together while minimizing conflicts between military activities and nearby land uses.

Who is Involved?

The Greater Nashville Regional Council (GNRC) is leading the study on behalf of participating local communities, including the Clarksville-Montgomery County Regional Planning Commission, City of Clarksville, Montgomery and Stewart counties in Tennessee, and Christian and Trigg counties in Kentucky.

GNRC represents city and county governments across Middle Tennessee and its mission is to assist local communities and state agencies in the development of plans and programs that guide growth and development in the most desirable, efficient, and cost-effective manner, while ensuring the continued long-term livability of the region. 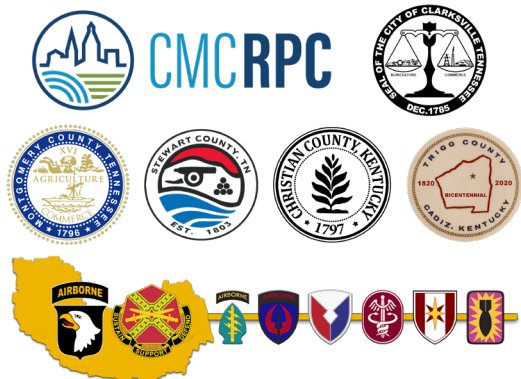
From 5 p.m. to 6:15 p.m. explore interactive stations, meet the project team and learn about the study area, purpose and planning process.
